Underwater Hockey


- AKA "Octopush"
- 1950s England
- Recognised by International Olympic Committee
 - Not an olympic sport
- Regional, national, and international championships
- Necessary gear: mask, snorkel, fins, gloves, puck, and a 30cm stick
- <u>6 players</u> per side
- Must hold your breath
- Not a contact sport





CHESS BOXING

- Invented in a 1992 French comic book Froid Équateur by Enki Bilal
- Began in Berlin in 2003
- 11 rounds
 - o 6 of chess
 - o 5 of boxing
- Each round lasts 3 minutes
- How to win: <u>checkmate</u> or beat them at boxing
- Gear: boxing gloves, boxing ring, chess board

Cheese Rolling

- Annual event in Cooper's Hill, England
 - On Spring Bank Holiday
 - Last Monday of May
- 3-5 kg wheel of Double Gloucester cheese
- Objective: catch the cheese OR first to reach the bottom of the hill
- Cheese can reach up to 110 km/h (70mph)
- Unknown origins
 - Roman history or 15th century?
 - New Year's Tradition

- Leicester, England, 1997
- Recognized in 1999 with the group Extreme Ironing International
- 2002 World Championship in Germany
- 2008 72 divers set a World Record for number of people ironing at once
- 2016 Official Extreme Ironing Club at De Montfort University in Leicester

ZORBING

- Human hamster balls
- Created in the 1980s by the Dangerous Sports Club
 - Eventually abandoned
- 23 meter **diameter** sphere
- Popularized in 1994 in New Zealand
- Participants are called *Zorbonauts*
