Where is it celebrated?

It is celebrated in English-speaking countries like the UK, Ireland, Australia and Canada.

In France, the USA and other countries, it is called 'Mardi Gras' or 'Fat Tuesday'.

The timeline

- Pancake Day is always on a Tuesday in February or March.
- It is the day before Ash Wednesday, the start of Lent.
- Lent is a period of 40 days before Easter when people often give up or stop eating things that are bad for them like chocolate or fast food.
- At the end of Lent is Easter.

Pancake recipe

Ingredients:

- One cup of flour
- One cup of milk
- One large egg
- Some salt
- Some butter or oil
- Lemon juice
- Some sugar











Method

- 1. Fill one cup with flour and put into a bowl. Fill another cup with milk and pour into the bowl.
- 2. Crack the egg into the bowl and whisk the flour, milk and egg until the mixture is smooth.
- 3. Put butter or oil in a pan, and when it is hot, put some mixture in the pan and move the pan to make a thin pancake.
- 4. After one minute hold the pan carefully and throw or toss the pancake in the air to turn it over. Now cook the pancake on the other side.
- 5. When the pancake is ready, squeeze some lemon juice and put some sugar on it and eat it immediately.
- 6. If you don't like lemon juice, eat them with jam, chocolate sauce or ice cream. Delicious!
