What is an article?

You read a notice from a magazine or website asking for articles. The notice gives the topic of the article and includes some questions. You write your article on that topic.

Tips:

- Read the task carefully so that you understand what you need to write.
- Think about who is going to read your article.
- Answer all the questions in the task.
- Use connectors (e.g. but, so, because, either, or) to link your ideas.
- Use adjectives to make your writing more interesting.
- When you are describing something, give positive and negative points about it.
- You can start with an opening question, to interest your readers.
- Invite other people to give their opinions.
- Check your work for grammar or spelling mistakes

Useful language

Linking ideas: you have many linkers in my previous post: Linkers

- either ... or ...
- as soon as
- except
- so that
- although

Giving your opinion: you have many ways to express your opinion in my previous post: Speaking expressions to interact with others

Opening questions

- Have you ever...?
- Do you ever wonder...?
- What do you think about...?
- Are you one of those people who ...?

Inviting other people to give their opinions

Do you think (that) …?

- What do you think of this idea/plan?
- Have you got any suggestions / good ideas?

Making positive comments

- The good thing about ...
- The best thing is ...

Describing problems


- The only bad thing is ...
- One disadvantage is that...


Making a recommendation

- If you watched/saw/tried this, you'd love it.
- On the whole, I would/can recommend this (concert/TV show/restaurant/film).
